SB 2757, Commission on the Status of Women, was brought up and debated with several amendments on 02/08/01.

Senator Walls' amendment (attached) created the most interesting debate.

The amendment directed DFA to assign space to the Commission in Woolfolk. When asked about where in Woolfolk, a comment was made that the guy in the center of this building (Capitol) had tons of extra space. The debate progressed with a Senator (didn't get the name or voice) stating that the Governor's Office had extra space on the 1<sup>st</sup> floor because they took it from the Public Service Commission. In fact, the Public Service Commission was looking for space outside of Woolfolk because their space was taken by the Governor's Office. The amendment died and the bill passed.

This matter was dealt with during the meeting with Gary Anderson, Margaret Hill and Don McCracken. The reality is LBO moved PSC and not the Governor's Office.

Thought you might want to be aware of what the public perception is among the legislators.
