School Nurses

To provide a school nurse per every 750 students-need 331 more statewide @ \$35,000 per nurse (salary, benefits, supplies)

\$11.59 pending- exploring funding by EPSDT screenings and administrative billing. (Department of Health is doing a pilot to explore if nurses can do enough EPSDT screenings to fund his/her position. Kidney Care has put up grant money to pay for this pilot to initially fund 10 sites.) After completion of pilot will pursue putting a nurse in every school.

Mammagrams

will provide mammagrams for women between age 40-50 that have no health insurance and are not covered under other programs. (\$62.23/screening) or Medicare without co-pay.

\$2.10 pending- exploring this to see if we can provide federally eligible services to cover mammagrams to all uninsured women, and increase access in rural areas.

Existing programs that are not meeting the needs due to education and infrastructure issues.

Dental Sealants for all eight year old children when molars come in.	Medicaid currently pays for sealants but we have a shortage of dentists, especially in rural areas. CHIP will also cover sealants effective 2002. Medicaid covers sealants but providers say reimbursement too low. Need to educate public that service is available.
