Hardship, Conflict, and Change: Mississippi 1929–1954

From 1930 into the 1950s, Mississippi and its citizens were affected by national events.

The Great Depression's hold on the nation extended into Mississippi. Public works programs such as the Tennessee Valley Authority and the Civilian Conservation Corps brought new opportunities and technologies to the state. The Works Project Administration encouraged artists, authors, and others to document its people and history.

The United States, embroiled in two wars, called for Mississippi men and women to fight and work for their nation overseas and at home. African American citizens after fighting for freedom returned home to the Jim Crow South.

Come to the Old Capitol Museum and learn more about this time in Mississippi's history and how to use the information in your classrooms. Additional presentations will cover William Faulkner, diversification of Mississippi's economics, and the rise of the Dixiecrats.
