Message: Dear Sir: Between July 1, 1995 and January 1, 2000, nonviolent inmates are not eligible for parole because they fall under the Truth in Sentencing Law (85%) Under the 85% Law there is a four(4) year six(6) months "Block-In" for nonviolent offenders between July 1, 1995 and January 1, 2000. This excessive length of stay creates violent agitation and great confusion for the inmate ultimately costing the taxpayer more money for this harsh parole "Block-In".
