The Mississippi Department of Archives and History (MDAH) is pleased to offer the Medgar and Myrlie Evers Research Fellowship to support scholarly research using the <u>Medgar Wiley and</u> <u>Myrlie Beasley Evers Papers</u> and <u>related materials at MDAH</u>. The program seeks to nurture upper-level graduate student and faculty scholars at the beginning of their academic careers, to increase their life-long interest in history, and to promote continued academic and public appreciation of Medgar Evers' life and work, the Civil Rights Movement in Mississippi, and the struggle for human rights. One research fellowship with a stipend of \$5,000 will be offered to a graduate student enrolled in an accredited college or university.

The recipient is expected to be in residence for a minimum of two weeks during the summer to conduct research at the William F. Winter Archives and History Building in Jackson, Mississippi. At the conclusion of their stay, the fellow will be asked to give a presentation and submit a summary report on the fellow's research findings.

The stipend may be used to cover travel, accommodations, and other expenses during the recipient's time researching at the archives. (Ineligible costs include computer equipment, hardware, or software; childcare, and photo framing/matting.) The stipend will be paid in increments, with the final payment given upon submission of the summary report.

The Medgar and Myrlie Evers Institute and MDAH will have the opportunity to utilize the product(s) if they are deemed appropriate and of benefit to the sponsoring parties.

- 2. **Proposal** (no more than five pages, typed, double-spaced)
 - Describe the proposed research topic, methodology, use of MDAH holdings, and research product(s).
 - Explain how this research will draw on the primary resources at MDAH and explain why the MDAH holdings are appropriate to this research. Indicate by collection title, series, and series title the specific holdings to be used.
 - Explain the research methodology to be used for this project. Include a brief description of preliminary research and a selected bibliography of works that directly influence the proposal.
 - Include a description of the intended product(s), which may include a paper, thesis, dissertation, article, book, lecture, exhibit, broadcast, and/or website.
 - Indicate your anticipated schedule.
 - Indicate your estimated expenses (travel to and from, and housing in, the Jackson, Mississippi vicinity; and other).
- 3. Curriculum Vitae
- 4. Two Letters of Recommendation from your academic advisors
- 5. Supporting materials may be submitted but are not required

The fellowship recipient will be selected and notified in early April.

The fellowship recipient must be enrolled in a graduate program at an accredited college or university, or a faculty member early in their academic career.

Selection Criteria

Scholastic contribution

- How will this proposed work contribute to the scholarly research on Medgar Evers, Myrlie Evers, and the Civil Rights Movement in Mississippi and/or the nation?
- What is the potential of this applicant to contribute to new and unexplored understandings of Evers and the Civil Rights Movement?
- How will this proposed work contribute to scholarly research on human rights, and contribute new understandings of this overall topic?
- How will the product promote or encourage future study of the topic?

Proposed research topic, methodology, use of MDAH holdings, and research product(s)

- How will this research utilize the primary resources at MDAH? How appropriate is the Medgar Wiley & Myrlie Beasley Evers Papers and other MDAH holdings to this research?
- What is the proposed research methodology?
- How innovative is the proposed research?
- What is the overall quality and clarity of the proposal?
- Is the product appropriate to the research topic?
